



YOUR UNITED WAY DOLLARS WORKING IN BELMONT COUNTY

- 695 persons received disaster assistance, health & safety training, services to military families, and /or donated blood through the American Red Cross.
- Catholic Charities West Virginia helped 70 households with emergency rent, utilities and/or food pantry assistance.
- 448 girls were active in the Girl Scouts.
- 31 individuals were assisted through Family Service Upper Ohio Valley with various needs.
- 360 children were served by Harmony House for forensic interviews.
- 663 residents participated in educational programs and advocacy through Harmony House.
- 13,300 people received assistance with emergency rent, food, utilities, etc. at the Salvation Army, Belmont County.
- 2,700 individuals received Christmas Assistance from the Salvation Army, Belmont County.
- 1,500 people were sheltered at the Salvation Army, Belmont County.
- 155 residents were helped with emergency assistance, i.e. utilities, from St. Vincent de Paul Society.
- 639 Clients received counseling services through Tri-County Help Center
- Tri-County Help center received 262 Crisis hotline call and sheltered 28 adults and 32 children in their emergency shelter.
- Wheeling Health Right served 3,959 patients from Belmont County.
- 54 individuals received help and support from the YWCA's Family Violence Prevention Program.
- 203 women were helped by the "Y Not Repeat" Boutique at the YWCA.

- 33 young moms from Belmont County were mentored or received clothes/baby essentials from Gabriel Project of West Virginia.
- 36 residents received assistance with vision screenings and participated in the workshop at Seeing Hand Association.
- 830 people participated in health and physical fitness programs including aquatics and team sports at the YMCA.
- 39 residents received assistance with emergency rent, food, utilities, etc. through Information Helpline.
- 477 people received linkage and referral services with Information Helpline.
- 1,406 participants attended educational presentations by Seeing Hand Association
- 2 residents were tutored through Literacy Volunteers of Marshall and Ohio Counties.
